Pupils will understand that rules and regulations are in place to keep us safe and happy. Pupils will know how to stay safe in situations, including water, railways, roads and bonfire night. Children will know to call 112 or 999 if an accident occurs in these situations.

Key knowledge and threads

Key thread: Health and Wellbeing

- Know that they must follow rules and regulations to keep safe and happy
- Know that social media, games and online gaming, films and televisions have age restrictions to keep them safe
- Know that they should not share personal information online
- Know that they must tell a trusted adult if someone asks for personal information or images online
- Know that they must tell a trusted adult if they are frightened or worried by something seen or read online, inappropriate content and contact
- Know the water safety code: stop and think, stay together, in an emergency – float, call 999 or 112
- Know the road safety code: stop, look, listen, think
- Know not to cross railway lines or go on them
- Know that they must not touch fireworks, but to wear gloves when holding a sparkler
- Know they must stand well back from a bonfire
- Know to stop, drop and roll if their clothes catch fire



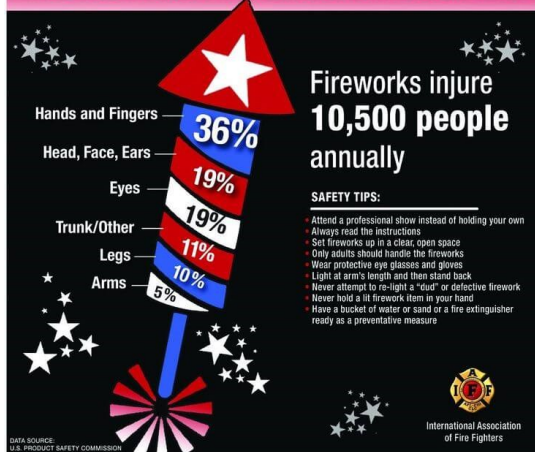
