

Living in the Wider World 2

This unit will allow pupils to recognise what factors affect the job they choose to do. They will understand different jobs are paid differently and that there are a variety of routes into careers. Children will be able to identify jobs they may like to do when they are older and characteristics of an attractive employer.

Key knowledge and threads

Key thread: Living in the Wider World

- Know what jobs that they might like to do in the future
- Know that some jobs pay more than others
- Know that some people choose to do voluntary work which is unpaid
- Know that there is a variety of routes into work e.g. college, apprenticeships, university, training
- Know that pay, working conditions, personal interests, strengths and qualities, family, values might influence people's decisions about a job or career
- Know that stereotypical assumptions can deter people from aspiring to certain jobs)
- Know that workplaces supporting diversity and inclusion to promote people's career opportunities are more attractive
